OUR ORGANISATION

I.GENESIS:

Social Education Economical Development Society (SEEDS) is a non-governmental organization promoted by a Gandhian worker Thiru S.D. Pandian who had been associating for 8 years with Tamilnad Sarvodaya Movement. It is to be noted that both his father and grandfather were also Gandhian Workers and played active roles in the Sarvodaya Movement. Realising the significance of principles of peace and non-violence and the right based developmental activities, Mr.Pandian, in association with the like minded individuals undertook socio economic development activities in the most backward areas namely Aruppukottai, Tiruchuli and Karaiyapatti Blocks of Virudhunagar district which is one of the backward district in Tamilnadu during the period of early nineties. In the year 1995, with the motto of professionalizing the community services, he along with his colleagues, and village leaders established a non-governmental organization Social Education Economical Development Society (SEEDS), which was a registered society under the Tamilnadu Societies Registration Act of 1975.

The mandate of the organization is to enable marginalized and disadvantaged rural women to achieve their socio-economic development through a process of organization and participation, and promoting child centered development. In pursuant to this end, SEEDS has been reaching out to more than 10,000 families in 55 Villages within the blocks of Aruppukottai, Thiruchuli and Kariyapatti in the Virudhunagar District of Tamilnadu through the implementation of different programmes supported by Local NGOs, Government and Foreign Funding Agencies.

SEEDS have been passing through a period of one and half decades in the progress of marginalized section of the community. There are trails and turbulences in this journey. Over these years SEEDS strategic approaches for the progress of the poor marginalized got into a shape of empowerment of women, micro credit and enterprises, organizing of unorganized women labours and development of small and marginal farmers

a) Women Empowerment :

SEEDS has faith in establishing a just society, and in the context of male chauvinism focus is very much needed in the socio economic empowerment of women and gender sensitization to the general community. SEEDS strategy and main activity in this regard is Self Help Groups. Initially, there are challenges in organizing SHGs in the target area as issues like money lenders, dubious chit funds, challenges in getting entry into financial institutions and very low level of awareness among women were overcome by proper orientation and inconsistent follow-ups. SEEDS availed the guidance and support of NABARD in this regard and successfully established linkages with nationalized banks and cooperative Banks. b) Micro Credit Programme:

Micro-finance programmes have, in the recent past, become one of the more promising ways to use scarce development funds to achieve the objectives of poverty alleviation and in fact have gained prominence in the development field and beyond. The operationalisation of micro-finance is simple, as it is a timely assistance , need based rating at the field itself, quick in process, a limited documents and easy instalments of repayment.

The women self help groups with which **SEEDS** works has about **3000** unorganized laborers, which consists of construction workers, Quarry Workers, Street Vendors, Charcoal Workers, Wood Cutters, and Match Workers & Fire Workers. These groups avail loans from **SEEDS** for their livelihood activities, micro enterprises and other social needs. These workers and their families are involved in a hazardous activity and are very much prone to injuries and fatal accidents and do not have any forms of protection or security. Realizing these issues, **SEEDS** started micro finance programmes from the year 2002 with the help of the following Banks and the details are given below.

d) Federation Activities:

SEEDS has evolved plans to federate the existing **SHGs** into Federations at various level, viz., Panchayat Level, Block Level and District Level in order to pave way for the emergence of **Block Level Community Based Benefit Trusts** and a **Non Banking Micro Finance Institution Ltd** at the district level. As an initial effort the **Athipatty Panchayat Women Self Help Group Federation** has been formed under the Tamilnadu Socities Registration Act, 1975 through Mahalir Thittam assistance. The Government Mahalir Thittam has permitted **SEEDS** to create such 15 Panchayat Level Federations in Aruppukottai and Thiruchuli Blocks.

e) Youth Empowerment Programme:

SEEDS constantly organize the youth into SHGs and so far we have organized 39 Youth SHGs in our target villages. Further, we have provided skill training to youth members who have been organized into SHGs under Mahalir Thittam. We have also extended financial linkage facilities to the Youth SHGs and the loans given in the last three financial years are given hereunder.

f) Organizing Unorganised Women Labour :

During the early twenties SEEDS took special efforts for organizing SHGs among the unorganized women labourers had an opportunity to understand the occupational related issues and challenges faced by them. It is observed that there are trade union movements but they targeted organized labourers. NGOs in general are yet to be oriented in organizing unorganized labourers . Introducing SHG concept is a step but to ensure the right based development of unorganized women labourers there should be a trade union for them. SEEDS took lead in association with fellow NGOs, sensitize the unorganized women labourers and helped them to form a separate organization in the year 2005 under the name of 'Udhayem Women constructive workers and unorganized labourers union, registered under Trade union Act 1926.

The NHRF (Norwegian Human Rights Fund) extended financial assistance to undertake human rights education and legal empowerment to the cadres of Trade Union. The important activities under this programme are Udhavem Leadership training to the caders and staff and exposure visit to witness and learn a successfully functional women trade union namely Women Voice, working with the domestic workers, Bangalore. Three Campaigns in three blocks were organized to educate and guide the members to ensure their rights and entitlements claiming all developmental schemes pertaining to them . The hall mark of the activities is district convention, organized consecutively 4 th year to make propaganda on their demands submitted to the government. The district convention was held on 13th June 2010 at District Head guarter Virudhunagar in the campus of Municipal Girls Hr.Sec. School, about 3000 women labourers participated in the convention. Hon. Minister Handloom Backward class welfare, Govt. for and of Tamilnadu Sri.K.K.S.S.R.Ramachandran preside over the convention and assured the participants that he would help them in fulfilling their genuine demands by the government of Tamilnadu. He appreciated the progressive journey of poor and marginalized women through trade union activity. The Union Chairpersons of Aruppukottai, Sivakasi and Virdhunagar Blocks gave felicitation address.

SEEDS through intensive campaign and village wise field work facilitated the union members to enrol and make use the scheme of benefits available in the welfare Board. The following statement shows the details in this regard.

g) ATMA - Agriculture Technical Management Agency:

SEEDS is an implementing agency of **ATMA**, a project promoted by the Agriculture Department of the Government of Tamilnadu. The objective of ATMA is to conduct trainings and capacity building on Agricultural Techniques to the Farmers. Under this programme 5 trainings were organized . Skills were imparted in vermincompost, panchakaviya, natural pesticides, and insecticides. Faculties from Regional Research Station, Kovilankulam and KVK , officials of department of Agriculture, and experts conducted training classes . Activities under farm schools – on paddy and cotton cultivation is to be scheduled in the coming monsoon season Sept-Dec 2010. Farmers are selected to undergo farm school learning. The details of the project operation is given below:

h. NABARD- water shed programme:

SEEDS is implementing a watershed programme to be implemented for a period of 3 years with the assistance and guidance of NABARD, Virudhunagar in a village panchayat .Alagiyanallur and Nanthikudu panchays in Kariapatti block. Under this programme 1180 hcs of lands in rain fed area will be treated under various techniques like farm ponds, deepening of ooranis, channel renovation, field bunds, bush clearance, levelling, and tree planting.

Village Water shed Committee (VWC) formation was completed with 15 members representing 3 hamlet villages. There are 2 members representing SC and 3 women farmers. The VWC members had an exposure on a model watershed programme implemented in Vilankulathur village watershed Muthukulathur block of Ramnad district for two days. They understood by witnessing water shed management, micro irrigation, soil testing, organic farming and vermin composting technologies and practical application. Following this exposure visit, a detailed project proposal for capacity building CBP was prepared involving VWC and submitted to NABARD, Chennai for onward sanction.

SEEDS pursues its activities further, through organizing farmers clubs , promoting subsidiary livelihood, establishing seed banks, value added in the agricultural products, ecological and environmental promotion, besides making attempts to providing housing and social security to the farmers in need.

i. Networking activity on Climate change:

SEEDS to fulfil its social responsiblility in containing the climate change had joined in the net work under SINFAO. In two panchayats namely 1. 2 PRA was conducted and data were collected on various factors of climate change affecting agriculture, water, livestock and livelihood activities. SEEDS is making an attempt to draft a plan of action for experimenting to reduce the effects of climate change in the target panchayts. Moreover, preparing the children to work on climate change was an yet another activity undertook a movement activity Child Movement for Climate Justice with the help of RCPDS, Madurai. Α students rally with the participation of 700 school students was organized in Aruppukottai on 14.5 2010. The rally passed through 2 kms mainstreets of the town and concluded at the new bus stand, a human chain was demonstrated. The municipal Chairman of Aruppukottai and faculties from S.B.K. college, Aruppukottai participated in the human chain. As a follow up SEEDS is engaged in organizing Balar Panchayat in 20 village panchayt in Aruppukottai and Tiruchuli blocks with the participants of children in the age group of 13-18.

j. Promotion of Naturopathy:

Naturopathy is a traditional system of medicine practiced by our forefathers, as a way of life. Due to modernisation, urbanisation, there is a gap in the knowledge and practice of Naturopathy among the present generation. To create awareness with the help of National Institute of Naturopathy, Pune, a meeting was organized at Rajiv Nagar on 5/7/2009 30 SHG women participated and came forward to practice naturopathy and yoga.

To improve the school atmosphere in rural areas SEEDS with the help of a well wisher provided the facilities like fan, alimarah, chair and tables etc. to two schools functioning in remote villages at Pannaimoonadappu and Pulikurichi. A sum of Rs.25,000 was spent in this regard and SEEDS, the village and school community acknowledged to the sponsor namely Mr.B.Radhakrishnan, Deputy General Manager, HCL Technologies, Chennai.
